PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed "Iqaluit Marine Infrastructure - Small Craft Harbour" project is located within the Qikiqtani region (South Baffin) on the coast of the City of Iqaluit. The Proponent intends to improve and expand the existing small craft harbour facilities located at the City of Iqaluit in order to serve small boat users such as recreational users, hunters and fishermen, subsistence harvesters, marine outfitters and cruise ship tenders. The program is proposed to take place beginning with construction in the summer of 2018 with completion in 2019 with ongoing operations and maintenance following completion in the fall of 2020. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Extension to the existing municipal breakwater and development of additional breakwater
- Installation of and decommission of two (2) floating docks
- Construction improvements to the existing causeway to increase boat launching access
- Use of approximately 35,000 cubic metres [m³] bedrock sourced from an area of approximately 1 hectare
